

REFUGE – ACCESS – FUTURE

A PROGRAM FOR THREATENED RESEARCHERS

About the Program

With the start of the Summer Semester 2017, the University of Bonn establishes the pilot project "Refuge - Access - Future" for threatened researchers. It is financed by means of the Philipp Schwartz Initiative. The program will include courses and consultation for **researchers who found refuge in Bonn** and for **threatened researchers who currently work at the University of Bonn**. The entire program is free of charge.

Who can participate?

- Threatened researchers who have not been resident outside their own country for more than three years (threatened researchers are persons who are threatened by war/persecution or who can no longer freely conduct their research)
- Postdocs and advanced researchers (primary target group)
- Doctoral Students can be admitted depending on capacities
- Participants should reside in Bonn or in the region in order to be able to fully participate in the program (time table, see below)
- Language skills in German or English

How to apply

Please submit the following documents **until 15 February 2017**:

- CV and Publication List
- Brief documentation of threat (max. 15 lines)
- Brief documentation of aspirations (max. 15 lines)
- Own language assessment (German and English)

What is offered?

- German Courses (dependent on response rate and levels)
- Courses and workshops on the following subjects (currently at the planning state/dependent on participant's needs):
 - Intercultural Training
 - German Academia
 - Research Funding und Funding Application Practice
 - Job Application Practice
 - Social and Cultural Events
 - Individual Consultation

The entire program is free of charge!
